


STAKEHOLDERS EDITION

FINACIAL CORNER:

In an effort to communicate with all stakeholders of Sacred Heart School, we are sharing our financial information. The below two pie graphs reflect our current revenues and expenditures from July 2018 to February 28, 2019. It is our goal to update all of our stakeholders quarterly of our financial situation. We will provide updated reports to you as of March 31st and June 30th to complete our year. We appreciate the involvement and advice from our finance subcommittee of the SAC, Les Crutcher and Zeb Rocha.

Notes: Tuition Assistance includes Thrift Shop assistance, Mary Stuart Rogers Scholarships, Alvernaz Scholarships and any other donations made that are specifically designated toward tuition assistance. The Father McElligott Foundation has helped us to balance our budget this year by giving us funds to offset the costs of some of our educational expenses, these include teaching materials, computer programs and other instructional materials. The Misc. Fundraiser section includes the smaller fundraisers we participated in this year, Breakfast with Santa, gift wrap sales, cookie dough sales, poinsettia sales, See's Candy sales, the Jog-a-Thon and a few others. Approximately \$14,000 of this fund belongs to the Parent's Club. The Other Income section includes, Sacred Heart Church 2nd collections which generate approximately \$20,000, miscellaneous donations from families and alumni, and parents who buyout their Thrift Shop hours.

The Rose B. Yohannan Endowment Fund is a restricted fund, whose principal cannot be utilized. The Rose B. Yohannan Endowment Fund Scholarships are administered and awarded solely by the Foundation. The Foundation determines the amount available and the number of scholarships awarded.

SACRED HEART SCHOOL & THE FOUNDATION

This year the Father McElligott Foundation has funded many field trips, programs and professional development opportunities. They have also helped us to balance our budget by granting us \$50,000 toward allowable instructional expenses. The relationship between the Foundation and Sacred Heart School is healthy and strong. The Foundation is now working on reviewing scholarship essays. They look forward to notifying the recipients soon.



2019-2020 TUITION

The 2019-2020 school year will bring some changes to parent obligations and tuition as well. As one of the lowest charging schools in the diocese, and in all of Turlock, we feel confident in raising our tuition to match the cost of living increase, to be released by the state once the budget is enacted. COLA is projected to be between 3%-4% thus we are raising our tuition by 3%.

As well, we are eliminating the financial obligation of SCRIP as the program is not producing the return we have budgeted. Instead, we are simply including an additional \$250 per family. Registration rates are also increasing by \$50 as signing up for FACTS is now a requirement for many schools. This tuition tracking has been a cost-effective management system for collecting tuition.

Here are the new tuition rates for 2019-2020.

- 1 student \$5,325
- 2 students \$8,750
- 3 students \$11,825
- 4 students \$14,865

Registration \$525.00
